





Among the earliest settled regions of Australia, the Kimberley is also one of the country's least known. Here is where ancient landscapes whisper tales of time immemorial; where Aboriginal rock art some 17,000 years old is carved into sandstone and shale; and where some of the most fascinating geological wonders still reign – from the Bungle Bungle Range rising majestically from the plains to the towering waterfalls of King George River. Offshore lie thousands of eco-rich islands home to extraordinary birdlife including the Buccaneer Archipelago, Ashmore Reef Marine Park and more

## The Kimberley: enchanting and timeless

A truly legendary coast No matter where you find yourself in of wonders the Kimberley, magical landscapes and ancient wonders appear at every turn. Wild and remote with a storied history, here is a land the size of France that has been untouched by humans other than the ancient rock art carved into cave walls thousands of years ago. This nearly impenetrable region rewards devoted

adventurers with sparkling horizontal waterfalls, steep gorges and canyons, ancient mangrove forests and soaring red cliffs. Wildlife and wilderness abound, and no two journeys are ever the same. Travel with us into a land that time forgot but that you'll remember forever.

#### MITCHELL FALLS

Waterfalls don't usually go on for hundreds of metres, at least not lengthwise. Kimberley's remote Mitchell Falls splash down in four separate tiers for a cumulative drop of over 80 metres (more than 260 feet). Carved into sandstone over millions of years, they've created an impressive series of shimmering emerald water pools. As the river tumbles from one fall to the next, you can almost feel the primordial rhythm of this ancient land.



#### HORIZONTAL FALLS

Famed natural historian David Attenborough once described these falls as the "Eighth Natural Wonder of the World." The unique natural phenomenon yields horizontal waterfalls that seem to ebb and flow with the tide; reefs and islands appear, only to disappear again right before your very eyes, for an everchanging waterscape that reminds us of the incredible power the moon has over our experiences here on Earth every day.



#### MONTGOMERY REEF

Covering some 300 km² (116 mi²) to surround Yawajaba Island completely, this is the world's largest inland coral reef. Extremely biologically diverse, its wonder is revealed at low tide as the entire reef slowly emerges from the sea with water cascading down from the reef top. As you gaze upon the abundance of fascinating wild flora and fauna, you'll be enthralled by the way nature creates, and recreates, this magical disappearing act.



#### WANDJINA & BRADSHAW ROCK ART

Stored away for millennia in the red sandstone caves that line the shores here, more than 100,000 rock art paintings are estimated to exist in the area. A series of mysterious indigenous Wandjina paintings are said to depict the ancient spirits who created the waterways, mountains and wildlife of Kimberley. Nearby, the Bradshaw – or Gwion Gwion – rock art paintings grace the walls of several other caves, created in a clearly different style.

# Indonesia: exotic and mysterious

sun's kiss, and let your spirit soar as you witness the majestic Komodo dragons in their natural habitat. Here, where lush mountains meet the sea, every sunrise brings promise of new discoveries, and every sunset is a masterpiece painted just for you.

#### PALOPO, SULAWESI

Komodo dragon, Indonesia.

This highland region is home to lush rice terraces, misty mountains and an ancient settlement called Tana Toraja famous for its macabre culture. Among the most famous sights are the cliffside graves, seemingly protected by a row of eerie Tau-Tau statues staring down at you upon arrival. You can see a collection of tongkonan (Toraja traditional houses) with a cave cemetery, and megalithic stones that were used as grave site headstones.



#### PINK BEACH, KOMODO ISLAND

Small flecks of red coral mixed in with the fine white reef sand earned Pink Beach its name as the shore appears to have a rosy hue in certain light. With its protected reef, this stretch of coast makes a fine place to relax or enjoy a snorkel in the crystal-clear waters; you might spot a striped clown fish nestled among the protective tentacles of its sea anemone host, or see a grouper lazily swimming by a flamboyant soft coral.



#### BAU-BAU, BUTON ISLAND

Known for its market culture and stunning ikat weavings, this friendly fishing village extends a traditional warm welcome to visitors immediately upon arrival. Many come here to explore the largest fort in Indonesia – the unusual Buton Palace Fortress (Benteng Keraton) built by a sultan in the 16th century. Here you can enjoy a cultural performance and savour culinary specialties.



#### **PULAU SEMAU**

This exotic haven of deserted beaches is known for its vast expanses of pure-white sand, where green coconut groves slope lazily towards the crystal-clear turquoise waters. Here you can savour the island's fresh watermelon and mango, take a swim in the gentle offshore waves or go snorkelling amidst a world of tropical fish and coral reefs. You might choose to ascend the heights of Liman Hill for stunning views of this tranquil island.





#### Voyage highlights:

- Adele Island A hotspot for breeding birds and turtles and a nursery for young humpback whales and bottlenose dolphins, the sandy beaches and gorgeous tidal lagoon found here stand in remarkable contrast to the Kimberley's rugged coast.
- Horizontal Falls Located in Talbot Bay in the Buccaneer Archipelago, this
  unique marine phenomenon is created by powerful tidal currents pushing
  through narrow coastal gorges.
- Freshwater Cove A rare experience that few will ever know; here Aboriginal hosts extend a traditional welcome before sharing stories of their ancestors and rock art at this special place known locally as Wijingarra Butt Butt.
- King George River Depart Koolama Bay by Zodiac to navigate the nearvertical rock formations enroute to the magnificent twin cascades of King George Falls, among the highest in Australia.
- Hunter River Region (Kimberley) Gateway to the famed four-tiered Mitchell Falls, the immense mangrove system found here is home to numerous bird species and the infamous saltwater crocodile.

### A remote and rugged land of wonders


Waterfalls and rock Set sail from Darwin, gateway to the art galore jungled waterways and lush rainforests of Australia's Top End, bound for your immersive Kimberley adventure. Koolama Bay welcomes you with a Zodiac excursion to the King George Falls where saltwater crocodiles lurk below and giant raptors like the Brahminy kite soar above. A call at Swift Bay leads to a hike across the wild landscape where historic caves are etched with Gwion Gwion and Wandiina rock art. Look for curlew sandpipers, bar-tailed godwits and great knots on a birding excursion along Ashmore Reef, and spot sea turtles, lesser frigates and brown boobies on Adele Island. Witness the speed of the 12-metre tidal rushes in the Buccaneer Archipelago, a phenomenon matched only by the cascading waterfalls

on display at Montgomery Reef. Arriving at Hunter River, you're greeted by soaring red sandstone cliffs that stand sentinel over immense mangroves interlaced with narrow channels - home to mudskippers, fiddler crabs, saltwater crocodiles and the iconic Mitchell Falls; explore here on hikes, Zodiac excursions and helicopter adventures. There is more indigenous rock art to see on Jar Island, said to be the home of a giant sea spirit who made the water salty for marine animals. Returning to Darwin for an overnight stay, you'll be tempted to venture inland to explore Kakadu National Park or the birding haven of George Brown Darwin Botanic Gardens.

# Spellbinding landscapes and ancient cultures

**Into the realm of** Here is a voyage of contrasting wilderness, crocodiles and dragons from the Kimberley's striking red coast where towering cliffs rise up from turquoise seas to Indonesia's lush islands ringed with spectacular reefs and marinerich waters. This odyssey delves into the earliest expressions of mankind and Mother Nature that are singularly unique to the Kimberley: indigenous rock art etched into caves on Jar Island, and rock formations depicting spiritual ancestors at Freshwater Cove; the twin cascades of King George Falls, the four-tiered waterfalls of the Hunter River, and the rushing waters of Montgomery Reef. A day or two at sea prepares your senses for the scent of jungle rains, the taste of fresh rambutan fruit and the sight of endless blue seas dotted with jagged peaks of green. This

is Indonesia, where Komodo Island intrigues with its namesake dragons and pink sand beaches and Bali enchants with its terraced rice fields and emblematic temples. Beyond the mesmerising beauty of Pulau Semau, Palopo Sulawesi leads you to the land of Toraja and its mysterious traditions, Bau-Bau presents the Butan Palace Fortress, and Kupang rewards with cultural immersion in the village of Baun, once the centre of the Amarasi Kingdom (1615 to 1962). Pack your spirit of adventure and join us on this incredible journey of discovery.




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### Voyage highlights:

- Lacepedes Islands Often called Australia's Galápagos, this A-class nature reserve is paradise for bird lovers its brown booby colony may be the largest on the planet.
- Dampier Archipelago A biodiversity hotspot rife with coral reefs, sponge gardens and seagrass meadows make these waters ideal for snorkelling; four turtle species are found here.
- Montebello Islands Home to the endangered Mala (Rufous Hare-Wallaby) and the Djoongari (Shark Bay Mouse), this marine park boasts 150 species of hard coral, 450 species of fish and 170 species of echinoderms (sea-stars, -cucumbers and -urchins).
- North Muiron Island Part of the UNESCO-listed Ningaloo Coast, this is where warm waters of Indian Ocean collide with the cooler seas of the West Australian Current to form a biological hotspot of incredible diversity.
- Albrolhos Islands This extraordinary home to seabirds (including the only colony of Australian Lesser Noddy and two million Wedge-tailed Shearwaters), coral reefs, bearded dragons and wallabies belies a difficult history of shipwrecks and sordid tales.







# Remote archipelagos and rugged shores

Marine wilderness, Follow the arc from the Kimberley to UNESCO treasures Western Australia and discover an eclectic and rock art melange of fascinating archipelagos, sandy spits and rugged coasts. The Montebello Islands captivate with their corals and sea turtles, and the Dampier Archipelago boasts reefs, sponge gardens and seagrass meadows home to flatback and hawksbill turtles, ospreys and sea eagles, and more. As your journey takes you closer to the Kimberley Coast, the Lacepedes Islands emerge – an A-Class nature reserve often called "Australia's Galápagos" owing to its exceptional wildlife such as the endangered green turtle. Soon you'll explore the primeval rock art and natural wonders of the Kimberley, including the dazzling waterfalls of the King George and Hunter rivers and Montgomery Reef.




